Reading: Exploring and dissecting story elements, making personal connections to the text, comparing and contrasting points of view, finding an overall theme of a text with solid evidence is the focus of our Middle School ELA Curriculum. Units includes a combination of short stories, poetry, nonfiction texts, and novel studies.

Writing: Personal narratives, argumentative writing, explanatory writing, research projects.

Grammar/Vocabulary: Taught in conjunction with daily lessons and units as students gain knowledge of how the concept or vocabulary is used.


