Our People

- Our teachers are highly qualified with a combination of college degrees, Early Childhood Credentials, and extensive experience with preschool-aged children.
- Our teachers and assistants participate in ongoing professional development.

- Open communication exists between teachers, parents, and school administrators; information is exchanged about children's development and learning.



Our Classrooms

- Our classroom environments are creative, inviting and stimulating.
- Our rooms are well-equipped with sufficient materials that are organized and accessible to children.
- Our environments are adapted to the needs of children and set up for a wide range of activities that support learning.
- The building and the classroom are safe and secure; a system is in place for supervision at all times.

Our Learning

- Our curriculum fosters all areas of a child's development spiritual, cognitive, emotional, language, physical and social and is aligned with Diocese of Raleigh Curriculum Standards for Early Childhood.
- We use effective teaching approaches that are developmentally, culturally and linguistically appropriate for the young children we serve.
- ❖ The children are engaged in activities including arts and crafts, music, movement, alphabet and number activities, science and sensory activities, dramatic play, block play, writing activities, and manipulative toys.
- The daily schedule allows for small and large group learning, structured and independent activities, fine motor and large muscle play and quiet time.
- Children have access to enrichment programs such as Spanish, music, PE and art.
- Ongoing assessment of children's progress is provided.

Our Community

- Classroom communities are developed where children gain confidence and self-esteem and are given supportive approaches to problem-solving.
- The preschool program is part of an established setting for learning, and an integral part of the elementary school. There is a plan in place for the transition into kindergarten
- The school community is family oriented and encourages parents to be involved.
- Collaborative relationships with parents are established and maintained.
- Students are welcomed into a community of faith and begin learning about positive virtues and caring for others.
- Children engage with teachers and each other; they are confident, happy and comfortable.
